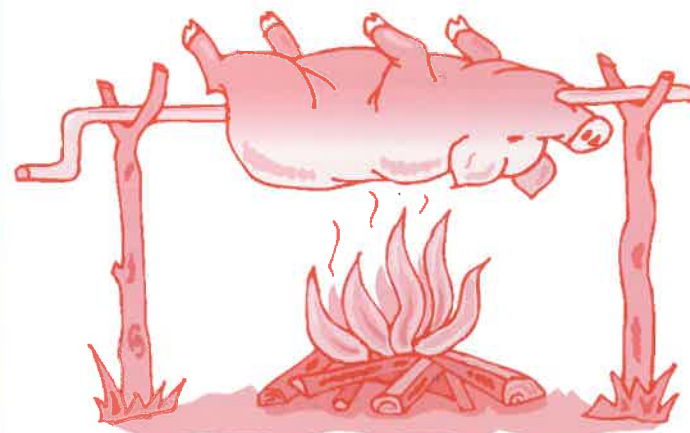

DID YOU KNOW?

On May 27th, 1921 a pilgrimage was made to a Ceremonial in Jacksonville, Florida, which cost the Temple \$18,929.90. Also in 1921, The Temple completed the erection of an addition to the Memphis Crippled Children's Hospital (not one of the Shriners' system), at a cost of about \$45,000, which was the first building in America to be erected wholly by Shriners' money for crippled children. In addition to this, the Temple paid \$2500 annually for maintenance for over 17 years and also gave the Hospital a swimming pool. Al Chymia never had anything to do with the management of this hospital, though they gave generously.

ALCHYMIA SHRINE CLOWN UNIT



The Clowns have been active these past months since the last (Mar. - April) edition of the Alchemist was published. How many clowns can you get in that little car? Well, we managed to get six (6) into our little red pop top during the annual Silky O'Sullivan Beale Street St Patrick's Day Parade on Saturday March 12th. It was misting rain but we had a great time working the crowds beforehand and following the Hillbillies, West, on Beale, once we all finally got into the parade.

We oversaw the Children's Easter Egg Hunt at the Temple starting with the actual boiling of fresh eggs on Thursday, Mar. 24th, dying, decorating, organizing prizes and potluck supper on Friday, culminating with the party and hunt, itself, on Saturday, Mar 26th. Everyone attending appeared to have a really nice time.

Thanks to all of the helpers, including a special appearance by the Easter Bunny.

In April we accepted a second recruit since this past December. In addition, we were instrumental in directing a sum, meant for the Clown Unit, from the Shrine School, to be directly deposited via Robert Carter to the Al Chymia Transportation Fund. One of our past presidents, Walter "Waldo" Smith had a stroke while in Florida and was undergoing physical therapy in Orlando. Meanwhile, Walter "Speedy" Fast, has a good six week recovery period from his April 12th cancer surgery. We bought a \$500 brick to be placed on the playground area at the St. Louis Shriners Hospital for Children. One of our clowns was on the April 18-20 trip but took his own car. That same clown was at the very first, out-of-town Boss Hoss ticket sale rally in Jackson, TN on April 16th. Harley gets around. The clowns also entertained at the annual Hot Wings Festival April 23rd in downtown Memphis.

We have been negotiating with the Ronald McDonald House and will be entertaining at their monthly birthday party on Wednesday, June 8th. We also plan on showing up at some Boss Hoss rallies during the summer and encourage all other units to send a representative or two and give Neil Blankenship some help.

DID YOU KNOW?

Judge Joseph W. Evans served as Potentate in 1979. During his tenure as Potentate, Al Chymia posed an all time high for membership at 7,105 Nobles. This figure was taken from year end membership reports to the Imperial Council. 1979 was the last year Al Chymia posted a new gain in membership until 2007. Potentate Jim Norman posted a year end gain of 73 members. In 2008, Potentate Wayne Bonner posted a net gain of 11 members. Potentates Norman and Bonner stressed fellowship and membership during their tenure as Potentate which proved to be a winning combination.

AL CHYMIA HISTORY

In 1920 at the Imperial Session in Portland, Oregon, Noble A. E. Cameron of Al Chymia was made an honorary member of the Imperial Council. A baseball game between the Nobles of Hamasa and Al Chymia netted \$2072.37. In this year the Imperial Council made it obligatory for local Temples to charge a minimum of \$7.00 annual dues, inclusive of hospital tax.

In January of 1923, The Shrine Circus netted the Temple \$7,000. At the December 13th Annual Elections, 857 Nobles were in attendance to see Noble Jeff Ramier elected Potentate. This was the last year for the Annual Meeting to be held in December. The fact that the Shrine Building was under construction made 1923 such an active year that 26 pages of the Recorders Minute Book was required to record the doings of the Temple.

In 1924 the Shrine Building was dedicated on February 4th with 400 Nobles in attendance. This was also the first year for the publication of the Alchemist under the editorship of Recorder W. A. Woodmansee. Because of the completion and dedication of

the Shrine Building, 1924 was a full year for Al Chymia. The activities for the year took up 48 pages in the Recorders Minute Book.

1925 was a year for Al Chymia to get used to its new temple. At the Spring Ceremonial, Judge Clifford Davis was created a Noble. Noble Davis went on to serve in the United States Congress for several terms.

In 1927 Al Chymia adopted new by-laws at the January meeting. In April the Imperial Potentate appointed a committee to administer relief to Mississippi River Flood Sufferers. This committee included Al Chymia Potentate W. B. Hill and administered \$31,465.21. The Fall Ceremonial had among its candidates Watkins Overton, Mayor of Memphis and Kenneth McKeller, United States Senator. At the December Stated Meeting another proposal was introduced to change the name Al Chymia to Memphis. After many comments from the Nobility, the proposal was withdrawn.

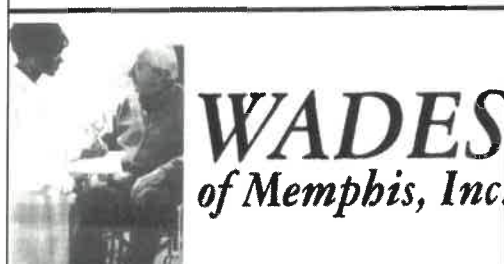
